

FOREIGN EXCHANGE STUDENTS

A maximum of two (2) foreign students may be enrolled in the Stanley-Boyd School District during an academic school year. The school will accept no more than one student from an agency. Exceptions to this rule shall be by the Stanley-Boyd School District Board of Education.

Each foreign exchange student shall be represented by a bona fide organization recognized by the Board of Education.

The District shall receive an application from eligible foreign exchange students by May 15th of the preceding academic school year. Applicants not meeting the deadline must be approved by the Board of Education.

The organization sponsoring the foreign exchange student shall:

- A) provide the district with documentation that the foreign exchange student is English proficient,
- B) provide the school district with the names, addresses and telephone numbers of the host family and the area representative for the sponsoring organization,
- C) provide the school district with documentation that the student has health and accident insurance coverage with a company affiliated with a US insurance underwriter,
- D) provide academic, health, and immigration records on the student,
- E) provide the district with arrival and departure dates of the foreign exchange student.

The Stanley-Boyd Board of Education will have the right to terminate this agreement if any of the above provisions are not fulfilled or the exchange student violates the rules and regulations established for student conduct.

Foreign exchange students recognized as seniors may participate in the graduation ceremony and will receive a certificate of attendance. Those foreign exchange students who meet all the graduation requirements set by the district shall receive a standard high school diploma. In order to be eligible for Top 10 Honors a foreign exchange student must have attended the high school during the junior and senior years.

Foreign exchange students will not be eligible for drivers education unless all students within the district and local parochial students have been served first.
