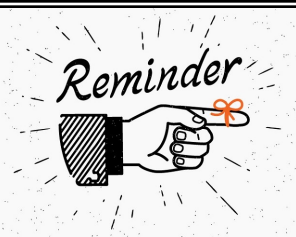

Morning Arrivals and Attendance at Stanley-Boyd Elementary

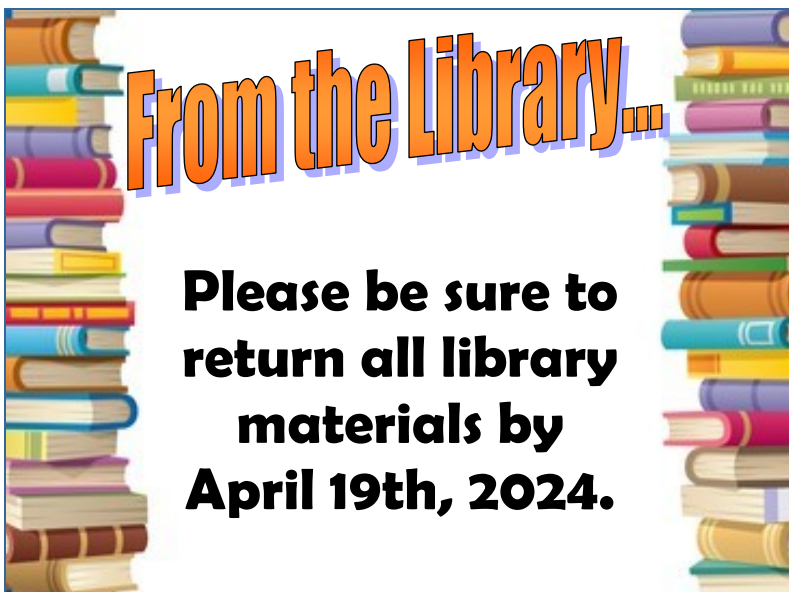
1. Student drop offs may begin at 7:45am.

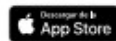

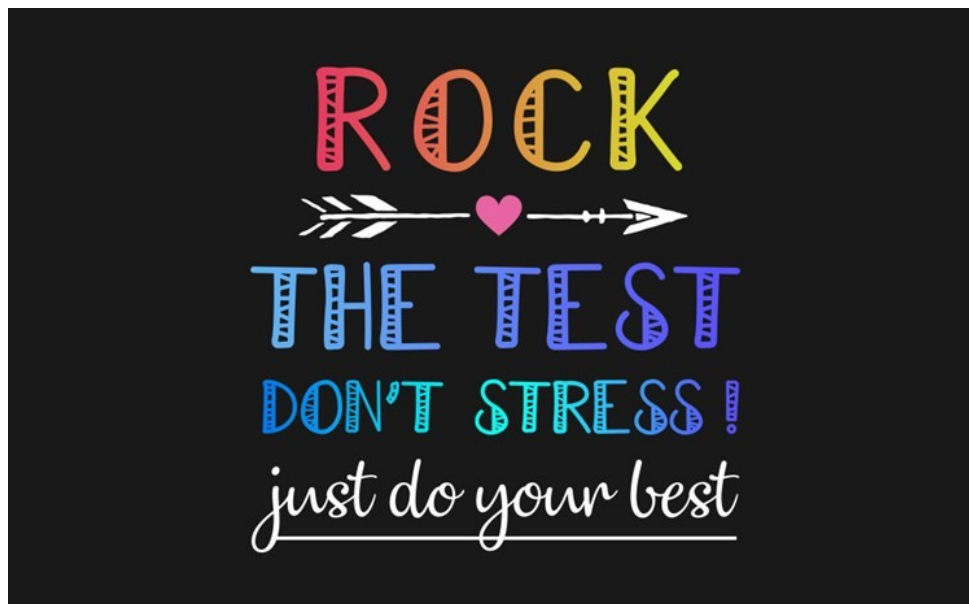


April is Forward Exam time!

Stanley-Boyd Elementary students will be taking the "Forward Exam" at the beginning of April. According to the Department of Public Instruction's website, this test is designed to gauge how well students are doing in relation to the Wisconsin Academic Standards. The standards outline what students should know and be able to do in order to be college and career ready.

We will be talking to all the students grades third through fifth about the Forward Exam in the coming weeks. Mr. Lew and Mrs. Ceranski will emphasize the importance of getting a good night's sleep, eating a healthy breakfast, and trying their best (not just for the state test) every day at school.

Please also take a moment to talk with your child about the importance of doing their best on the Forward Exam. We know that this test does not define your student, but it gives us insight into their learning here at school. It also helps us monitor progress, look at our own curriculum, and set goals at different grade levels. We understand that testing isn't easy for all students, but trying their best is what we strive for. 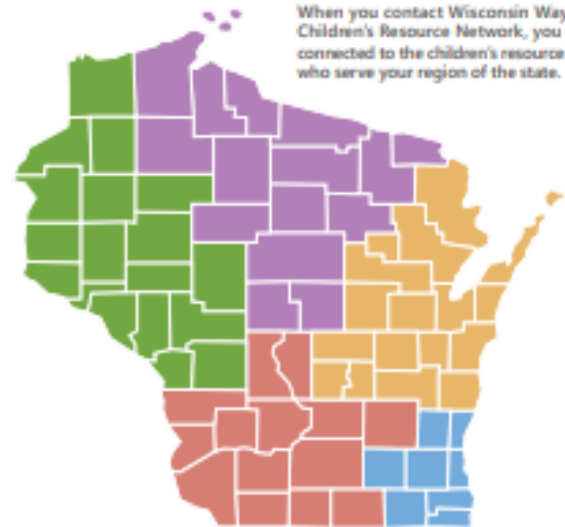
