

EMERGENCY NURSING SERVICES

Emergency Nursing Services shall be made available to all Stanley-Boyd School District Students.

The Stanley-Boyd school district has three basic responsibilities in regard to emergencies, accidents, and illnesses. The first is prevention, the second is health and safety education, and the third is a program of action. Schools are to give immediate and proper care, notify parents, and be certain the injured or ill are placed under the care of the parents, designated person, physician, clinic, or hospital.

Emergency Nursing Services shall be available during the regular school day and at all school sponsored activities of pupils in accordance with the state law. This includes providing immediate care within their scope of practice to protect the health or enhance survival chances of the injured or acutely ill and for administering necessary medications. The school nurse will provide oversight and training related to emergency nursing services.

Procedures for dealing with emergency accidental injury, illness and medication shall be established and published annually. These procedures shall also be reviewed annually with all health services staff and other appropriate staff members.

Responsibility for providing Emergency Nursing Services may be delegated to other qualified personnel by the registered nurse. This will include the administration of necessary medications and treatments. Designated school staff members will be provided information and education on students requiring special health considerations or individual needs.
