

STUDENT ATTENDANCE / FULL-TIME STUDENT

In accordance with Wisconsin Statute 118.15, all children between six (6) and eighteen (18) years of age must attend school full-time until the end of the term, quarter, or semester in which they become eighteen (18) years of age, unless they have a legal excuse, fall under one of the exceptions outlined in the state statutes 118.15, or have graduated from high school.

Procedures shall be developed by the administration to enhance the full attendance requirement and to determine appropriate action to serve as a deterrent to truancy. These procedures shall be in accordance with local ordinance and state law. The Stanley-Boyd Area Schools shall not deny student credit in a course or subject solely because of a student’s unexcused absences.

A normal school day at Stanley-Boyd Area Schools for the students at the various attendance centers shall be:

- a. Stanley-Boyd Elementary Schools from 8:15 a.m. to 3:30 p.m.
- b. Stanley-Boyd Middle School from 8:15 a.m. to 3:30 p.m.
- c. Stanley-Boyd High School from 8:15 a.m. to 3:30 p.m.

A full time student is in attendance during normal school hours. A full time high school student must enroll in all required classes for that grade level.

The Stanley-Boyd Area Schools reserves the right to contract with individual students for an alternate school day if the student falls under state guidelines as a “Student At-Risk” or the student has an Individualized Educational Plan.
